NO STALL AT WORKOUT AS BEAUTY GENERATION ROLLS TOWARDS CHAMPIONS MILE

Beauty Generation's (NZ) (Road To Rock) final fast work before Sunday's Gr.1 FWD Champions Mile (1600m) was not quite as billed after trainer John Moore changed his plan following a phone conversation with big-race jockey Zac Purton.

"It was a little different to the work I had in mind earlier in the week but that's because, on reflection, we had some little

concerns about jumping out of the gate," Moore said.

The handler said earlier this week that he intended to have the world's co-top rated thoroughbred break from the starting stall to "switch him on". Instead, the powerful bay broke from a standing start, a couple of beats behind a work mate.

“He jumps quickly from the barrier, and, after talking with Zac (Purton), there was a worry that we’d run the risk of him doing something to his hind quarters,” Moore said.

Beauty Generation breezed past a larger-than-usual gathering of photographers - bussed in especially for the champ’s 7am workout. The Road To Rock gelding, sporting cheek-pieces and under work rider Romain Clavreul, moved easily behind his companion as they galloped 800m down the back straight in 54s (30.1, 23.9).

“He was always going to go with a workmate - it’s good to chase, it gets them more focused,” Moore said. “We sent him with the old Group Three winner, Harbour Master - he’s retired now but he’s a good workmate. Beauty Generation enjoyed it, the work mate’s rider pulled up and Beauty just went on straight past him. I’m happy with that.”

Both horses continued around and cantered slowly down the home straight before easing to a walk.

And that gaggle of media snappers was there, waiting for the star draw. Moore told Clavreul to circle for a few moments as shutters rattled 10 to the dozen.

“He had a good blow,” Moore observed. “He enjoyed the work, but he needed that little bit of a blow-out because he’s a brute of thing - that was work that was needed. He was relaxed when he came back, so that was good too. Romain said everything was fine.”

Beauty Generation will face only six opponents in the HK\$18 million contest and is rated 11lb superior to the next best in the field, Conte (Starcraft), a horse he has beaten with ease in each of his last three races.

“It’s a shame we haven’t got anything from overseas to challenge him because it just lacks a really top rival,” Moore said. “But we’ve got a world champion here and people can pay 10 or 20 (Hong Kong) dollars to get in and watch him.

“It’s cheaper than going to an Andy Lau concert!” he concluded, referencing a popular Hong Kong pop icon.

LUPTONS MAKING PRESENCE FELT FOR TRAVIS

A good percentage of Mark and Cath Lupton's racing team will tackle Saturday's Gr.2 Travis Stakes (2000m) at Te Rapa.

The couple co-bred and co-own six-year-old Raise The Flag mare **Etah James (NZ)** and race Savabeel five-year-old mare **Yearn (NZ)**, with Mark Lupton training Etah James himself and leaving the conditioning of Yearn to Matamata trainer Karen Fursdon.

"It's a bit odd, training one to race against another one we own but they raced together in a sprint at Te Aroha earlier this month, though that was far too short for Etah James," Lupton said.

While failing to threaten that day, the step up to 2000m second-up has Lupton optimistic he can cause a boilover with Etah James, who has won six of her 16 starts, including the Gr.3 Lord Reims Stakes (2600m) in Adelaide as well as finishing second in last year's Listed Bagot Handicap (2800m) at Flemington.

"Her best form is past 2000m but she's won before at 2000m and she's really come on since Te Aroha. She galloped really well this (Thursday) morning and we're hoping she goes

a good race anyway," Lupton said of the \$71 outsider.

"She's rough in the market but some pretty good judges this time last year were rating her as one of the most promising stayers in Australia before the wheels fell off in the spring."

While Etah James' form dropped away, Lupton said she suffered ligament issues and was tying up in her shoulders, hence her return to New Zealand to recuperate.

"We've got her back ticking over nicely now and if she goes a good race on Saturday, we'll probably send her back to Australia. She's a staying mare and there's not much for her in New Zealand.

"I've never really used Andrew Calder before, but we think he'll be a good fit for her. We just want to make sure that it's run at a true pace. If Nicoletta starts getting away with soft sectionals, we've told Andrew we want to turn it into a true staying race."

Better fancied in the market is Yearn, a \$12 fifth favourite off her fast-finishing third in last Saturday's Gr.2 Easter Handicap (1600m) at Ellerslie.

"She's being tried over ground for the first time. She has never really done much over a mile till last week," Lupton said.

"But the way she finished off and covered the ground, we thought we'd put her in and roll the dice. Apparently, she galloped well this morning.

"We're not holding our breath that she'll run out a strong 2000m but she's going well and she'll go out after this one. Hopefully we can get a line on her at 2000m so we know what we should do with her for next preparation.

"That's the best race she's gone, last week, and that was coming from back and wide and she's run home in quick splits. We'd have love to have got the run the winner got. She's not big but she's got a big heart, so here's hoping."

ROCK ON WOOD COMPLETES WINNING TREBLE WITH AWAPUNI VICTORY

Progressive four-year-old **Rock On Wood (NZ)** (Redwood) remains unbeaten in his current campaign after scoring his biggest career victory in Thursday's Listed Manawatu ITM Anzac Mile (1600m) at Awapuni.

The Leanne Elliot-trained gelding made full use of a seven-kilogram advantage over proven Group One performer **Shadows Cast (NZ)** (Per Incanto) to down the topweight with a barnstorming finish over the final 200m.

Patiently handled by Elliot's son Ryan, who has been aboard the son of Redwood for all of his five career wins, including three on the trot in this preparation, Rock On Wood didn't have all favours when forced to race wide in mid-field throughout.

Elliot didn't panic as he set out after **Shadows Cast** who had driven to the front approaching the home corner and had established what looked like a winning break. Rock On Wood slowly wound through his gears and tackled **Shadows Cast** in the closing 100m before thrusting his head in front to grab the win, with **Cutting Up Rough (NZ)** (Per Incanto) finishing off well for third.

Leanne Elliot, who part-owns Rock On Wood with her mother Jill, was struggling to keep her emotions in check when spoken to after the race.

"We were pretty nervous today and I didn't know whether he had got there or not," she said.

"That was amazing.

"Ryan knows him quite well, so I

don't really say too much.

"I didn't want him back as far as last time and he had him a bit further forward, so it was just as well.

"He's real special (Rock On Wood)."

A son of the High Chaparral sire Redwood, Rock On Wood has now won five of his nine career starts after being purchased for \$26,000 from the Long Acres Stud draft at the 2016 Festival Yearling Sale at Karaka.

The victory completed a winning treble for Ryan Elliot on the day after earlier guiding the Team Rogerson-trained **Pluton (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) to victory in race 4 along with the Ralph Manning-trained **Che Guevara (NZ)** (Nadeem) in race 6. – NZ Racing Desk

Schofield hopes Rattan can give him HK G1

Chad Schofield will partner **Rattan (NZ)** (Savabeel) in Sunday's Gr.1 Chairman's Sprint Prize (1200m) in Hong Kong.

Schofield, who is yet to win a Group One in Hong Kong, has been aboard the Richard Gibson-trained Rattan in five of his seven wins including his 7 April success in the Gr.2 The Sprint Cup (1200m).

"I'd expect he'd run very well," Schofield said. "This is harder for him at the level weights and with a horse like Santa Ana Lane arriving, but I thought he won on his merits the other day and he came through the race well."

"I galloped him Monday on the grass. He had a very light gallop and felt really good. He's come through his win very nicely and taken no harm from it. He recovered really well, he's fresh and in good order at the moment."

Like so many before him, Rattan was sourced as a Derby horse but found extending to 2000 metres beyond him, and while he's won six races at 1400m and 1600m in Hong Kong it just might be that the definitive sprint trip of 1200m proves to be his forte.

"The step back in trip was a winning move. He such an honest horse he can handle 1400 (metres), a mile and even run well at 1800 (metres) but that's just due to his honesty and ability. The way he won last time and with his sectional times with the blinkers on, it's clear to me that 1200 metres is his best trip. He does have more stamina than most horses in the field so a nice, hot pace would allow him to come and unleash that big turn of foot he's got."

Enzo's Lad ready for feature Hong Kong sprint

Trainer Michael Pitman is enjoying the build-up to racing at Sha Tin on Sunday as his class sprinter **Enzo's Lad** (Testa Rossa) gets set to take on the Gr.1 The Chairman's Sprint Prize (1200m).

Pitman who prepares the dual Group One winner with son Matthew, was happy to answer questions when attending a media briefing prior to the all-important barrier draw for Sunday where his charge drew favourably in gate two.

"He's got a good temperament and I couldn't be happier," Pitman said.

"Up here it is phenomenal what you (Hong Kong Jockey Club) do for horses, they get so well treated."

"He flew in from Sydney and within half an hour the vets had taken a blood test and within an hour we had the results which I don't think would happen in too many places in the world."

"His blood was perfect after two days of travelling. He's a dude, he's pretty laidback for a sprinter, he doesn't get worked up, he's push-button and he doesn't need anyone going around to the barriers with him. I couldn't be happier."

Eminent to bounce back to form in Sunday's FWD QEII Cup

Sir Mark Todd believes **Eminent** (Frankel) can bounce back to his best form in Sunday's Gr.1 FWD Champions Mile (1600m) at Sha Tin if his current demeanour is anything to go by.

The Sir Peter Vela-owned five-year-old wasn't at his best when finishing a well beaten eighth behind Winx (Street Cry) in the Gr.1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes (2000m)

at his last start after producing an eye-catching effort for second in the Gr.1 Ranvet Stakes (2000m) in his first Australian start.

Todd has been pleased with the entire's work since his arrival in Hong Kong and is looking forward to Sunday's contest.

"He is an amazing horse. He's still a stallion and he copes with everything and the travel," he said.

"He enjoys the company, he travelled up with Enzo's Lad from Australia and they have mated up."

"He is a very independent horse as well. He arrived and has drank well and eaten well. He appears bright so we are very happy."

"We have had one good run and one bad run with him, so I am a bit nervous about making any predictions."

"All I can say is the horse is happy and bright and the draw will have a little bit of influence as well."

The Michael and Matthew Pitman-trained Enzo's Lad (Testa Rossa) will contest the Gr.1 Chairman's Sprint Prize (1200m) on Sunday where he will be ridden by James McDonald who also takes the mount on Eminent.

Productive season for Supera

Lightly raced mare **Supera (NZ)** (Savabeel) will have her final race of the season in the Gr.2 Travis Stakes (2000m) at the Cambridge Jockey Club's meeting at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Sir Peter Vela-owned four-year-old kicked off the season with two dominant

Metropolitan success for Savabeel 4YOs

The Mick Price-trained **Savaheat (NZ)** (Savabeel) made light work of his rivals at Sandown on Easter Monday winning the Le Pine Funerals Handicap (1800m).

Ridden by Damien Oliver, the four-year-old gelding by Savabeel travelled nicely at the rear of the field before making his move with 800m to go. He looped the field and hit the lead at the 500m mark and held off his challengers to win by a length from Tavirun (NZ) (Tavistock).

"It was a good win," stable representative Mick Nolan said.

"The 1800m suits him. The way the race was run suited him and he was going to be hard to beat in the straight home."

It was the third win for the \$220,000 graduate of Trelawney Stud's 2016 New Zealand Bloodstock yearling draft, and the first for the Price stable since transferring

from Darren Weir.

"This is probably his grade but with a bit of maturity he might get better," Nolan said.

"He is suited to these types of races. He is a fairly easy horse to train with no problems or issues."

Meanwhile, in Sydney the Bryce Heys-trained Subban (NZ), also by New Zealand's champion sire Savabeel, notched his fifth win from 11 starts when successful over 1800m.

Hong Kong win for O'Sullivan brothers

Band Of Brothers (NZ) (Sakhee's Secret), registered his second straight win over the Sha Tin 1400m on Monday and his second from just three starts in Hong Kong after being sourced in New Zealand.

"He is a promising type of horse and he'll get further than this," trainer Paul O'Sullivan said.

"We'll probably go to 1600m next time and he'll be up to Class 3, but he'll drop in weight with that rise in grade and he won well today. He copped a bit of a buffeting and overcame that."

The aptly named four-year-old son of Sakhee's Secret began his training with O'Sullivan's brother Lance, in New Zealand, as many of his stablemates have done.

"He didn't go through a yearling sale so I'm not sure what happened there," Paul O'Sullivan said of the Kevin Hickman-bred galloper. "They gave him to Lance to prepare him with a view to selling.

"I saw him last July and really liked him. He won a trial over there very easily. Have a good look at him, he's a smashing type and fortunately I had a group of owners here with a PPG permit so we were able to secure him," O'Sullivan said.

The gelding is raced by the Z Power Syndicate and was ridden by champion jockey Zac Purton.

Diva Express too swift at Avondale

Ruakaka galloper **Diva Express (NZ)** (Shamexpress) proved too swift for her two-year-old rivals when she took out the NZB Insurance Pearl Series Race (1200m) at Avondale on Thursday.

Prepared by Ken Rae and daughter Krystal Williams-Tuhoro, the Shamexpress filly was the most experienced in the field having her sixth raceday start in the contest, a record that included a third

Former shuttle stallion **Mastercraftsman** was yesterday provided with his 61st stakes winner courtesy of Agente Segreto's victory in the Listed Emanuele Filiberto (2000m) in Milan.

The three-year-old colt, who was last seen winning the Premio Razza di Vedano (2000m), continued that good form, beating Thunderman into second.

Mastercraftsman, who stood at Windsor Park Stud in Cambridge for four seasons, now stands exclusively at Coolmore Stud in Ireland for a fee of €30,000 and his progeny is headed by 12 Group One winners.

Kiwi jumper the King of Oakbank

Zed Em (NZ) (Zed) was being toasted on both sides of the Tasman when he was hailed as the King of Oakbank at the popular South Australian meeting on Saturday.

Three of Zed Em's five Wairarapa owners had a raceday experience they will never forget when being on course to watch the horse they refer to as Bobby extend his unbeaten Oakbank record to five with the completion of the Von Doussa (3250m) – Great Eastern Steeplechase (4950m) double for the second year in succession.

Last year Zed Em became the first horse to land the Von Doussa – Great Eastern Steeplechase double since the John Wheeler-trained Tobouggie Nights (Tobougg) in 2012 and the pressure was on him on Saturday for a repeat after winning the Von Doussa for the third successive year a couple of weeks earlier.
