## HO HO KHAN CONQUERS **GROUP THREE**

The David Hall-trained **Ho Ho Khan (NZ)** (Makfi) advertised his potential for top-grade races next season with a fine victory in the Gr.3 Queen Mother Memorial Cup Handicap (2400m) at Sha Tin on Sunday.

Hall suggested his charge would not press on to the Gr.1 Standard Chartered Champions & Chater Cup (2400m) at the end of this month, with the Hong Kong International Races in December a probable long-range target for the improving four-year-old.

"My intention would be to put him away now and hopefully he can mature a bit more and we might have a

horse for December," Hall said.

Jockey Vincent Ho had Ho Ho Khan mid-pack on the rail in the nine-runner feature before the rider switched out at the top of the straight and wound up his mount to accelerate past front-runner Helene Leadingstar (Wanted) 250m out.

The New Zealand-bred colt stretched two and a half lengths clear of runner-up Savvy Six (Pour Moi) on his first attempt at the distance.

"I knew he would handle the distance and as long as I balanced him up and had a nice, relaxed, smooth run he'd be

a good chance. He did it very well," Ho said.

But neither trainer nor jockey was advancing the notion that the compact son of Makfi is a mile and a half specialist in the making.

"He might just not be an out-and-out 2400-metre horse," Hall said of the 2.8 favourite. "At the 2000 metres he was still a bit immature. He hasn't even had a set of blinkers on yet so he still might be sharp enough for 2000."

And Ho believes his mount could have won his previous race, a quality-packed 2000m Class 1, had he enjoyed a more convenient passage.

"Last time he was third behind Dark Dream and if I'd had a smother run I could have beaten him," Ho said. "At 2000 metres he can still win, but it would depend on how the race pans out."

"He has a good heart and a good temperament and he keeps improving."

Raced under the name Mulanchi in New Zealand when trained by Tony Pike at Cambridge, Ho Ho Khan won one of four starts in his homeland and was sold as a private purchase through Queensland bloodstock agent John Foote.

# SOUTH AFRICAN GROUP TWO WIN FOR NZ-BRED

**F**rosted Gold (NZ) (All Too Hard) landed the Gr.2 South African Nursery (1160m) on Champions Day at Turffontein under a typically powerful ride from Anton Marcus.

The Mike de Kock-trained New Zealand import turned the tables on old adversary Twilight Moon (Wylie Hall), who won last time the duo clashed. In their first meeting it was a dead-heat.

Bred by Lib Petagna's JML Bloodstock, Frosted Gold, starting at 4-1 – with Twilight Moon the favourite at 7-2 – came with a strong run to overhaul his Paul Matchett-trained rival and win the R750,000 (approx. NZ\$80,000) contest by 1.5 lengths.

Marcus said that the son of All Too Hard had won well and would improve. Good gate speed from the 1160m start allowed the master jockey to find a good striking position just off the pace and, when the question was asked, the grey kicked readily.

"It's great to crack a feature race for (owner) Dave MacLean, who messaged me with good wishes in the early hours of this morning," Marcus said.

"Frosted Gold has good gate speed and when I asked, he kicked. He was looking for company late and based on that he has improvement to come."

Trainer Mike de Kock said that Frosted Gold would possibly go for the Gr1 Tsogo Sun Gold Medallion at Scottsville at the end of the month,

but that he will stay at home if there is a track bias.

"He wants to be ridden quieter, he likes to run at them. He's still a green horse," De Kock said.

Out of the Verglas mare Mary D'Or, JML Bloodstock sold a Tavistock half-brother to Frosted Gold at the recent New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sales through Blandford Bloodstock, the Matamata-based breeding operation owned in conjunction with the Bax family.

The Tavistock colt fetched a bid of \$50,000 to the bid of Ohukia Lodge and will likely be re-offered at the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run Sale later this year.

# STARTLING PERFORMANCE HARD TO IGNORE

**L**ightly raced three-year-old **Ignored (NZ)** (Savabeel) produced one of the day's highlights when she overcame a tardy start to win against the older horses at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained Savabeel filly was expected to be prominent in the rating 72 1600m event, but looked to have blown her chances when coming out of the starting barrier awkwardly and

losing five lengths to the rest of the field.

Rider Darren Danis didn't panic as he allowed his mount to find a steady rhythm before latching on to the back of the pack with 700m to run. Angled towards the inner in the home straight as the field fanned out in front of her, Ignored took full advantage when the gaps opened closer to the rail to win by just under a length in a stunning performance.

Co-trainer Andrew Forsman said he thought the filly's chances were gone when he saw her miss the start.

"When you're up against the older horses you need everything to go your way and when she missed away, I was pretty sure she was out if it," he said.

"I guess it helped when they all fanned wide as it gave her the chance to pick an inside run and save some ground, but she showed plenty of grit

and some good acceleration to get up and win."

Forsman isn't sure of the plans going forward for the filly who races in the colours of owner and co-breeder, Waikato Stud.

"I had a quick talk to Murray (Baker) about whether she might be one to take to Brisbane, but he wasn't sure as she's not nominated for anything over there at this stage," he said.

"I guess we will just play it by ear and see how she does before making any plans as I don't think she is a filly who will really cop wet ground so if the tracks pack up, she might be best heading out for a spell."

One member of the Baker Forsman team that more than confirmed he is

on track for the Brisbane three-year-old features was Zed gelding **Bobby Dee (NZ)**, who also produced a strong-staying effort to score over 2200m in rating 82 company.

"He was very good as he had to sustain a long run and he stuck to his task well," Forsman said.

"It's hard for the three-year-olds against those battle-hardened stayers and there were horses in the field that have been running in open-grade races, so to win as comfortably as he did was good to see.

"He is on track for Brisbane where his main aim is the Queensland Derby (Gr.1 2400m)."

Stablemates **Mental Telepathy (NZ)** (Shocking) and **Artiste (NZ)**

(Mastercraftsman) also performed with credit when finishing third and fourth respectively with Forsman advising Artiste could be heading to the spelling paddock while Mental Telepathy is a possible Gr.3 Campbell Infrastructure Rotorua Cup (2200m) contender as long as the weather holds, and the tracks remain firm.

# GRAND NATIONAL WINNER ON TRACK FOR FIRST JUMPING FEATURE

Last year's Grand National Steeplechase (5500m) winner, **Shamal (NZ)** (Zabeel), looks like he is right on track to add another coveted jumping prize to his locker after he took out the Ken & Roger Browne Memorial Steeplechase (3900m) at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Te Rapa event is the traditional lead-up to the Signature Homes Waikato Steeplechase (3900m) in a fortnight, a race where the Zabeel eight-year-old will look to improve on his fourth placing in 2018.

Un sighted since finishing third in the Great Northern Steeplechase (6300m) at Te Aroha in September, Shamal entered Saturday's event with just one 1600m trial under his belt.

Trainer Ken Duncan had put plenty of work into him and that preparation showed as he looped the field from last at the 800m to hit the front with two fences to clear. In the hands of regular rider Buddy Lammas, Shamal flew the last and kept up a resolute gallop to score by a length from Arabian Duke (NZ) (Bachelor Duke) with stablemate Justnametheprice (NZ)

(Howbaddouwantit) providing Duncan with a top result when finishing third.

Duncan was thrilled with the win as he went into the race thinking his charge may have been a run short.

"It was a huge effort that took me by surprise a wee bit as I thought he needed one," Duncan said.

"He does like being on top of the ground though.

"I actually missed his move at the 600m when he went from last. I was thinking that's a great possie for him and the next minute he was in front."

Duncan confirmed he was planning to have Shamal tackle the major steeplechasing events this season although he was worried about the consequences of a re-handicap following the victory.

"I just hope I haven't shot myself in the foot with the handicapper," he said.

"He will take a similar path to last year, although he is a day-to-day proposition, but at the moment we have him pretty right." – NZ Racing Desk

# WEKA CHEER-SQUAD ON HAND AT RICCARTON

It wasn't hard to know how race three at Riccarton was unfolding on Saturday afternoon, you just had to listen to the roars of the large group on-course to support race favourite **Morweka (NZ)** (Showcasing).

The speedy Showcasing mare had the members of the Galloping Wekas Syndicate Number Two and their many friends roaring with appreciation as she streaked clear in the home straight to win the rating 82 1200m contest by more than seven lengths.

Syndicate member, Joe Wallace, who was on hand to witness the triumph after sneaking away from a wedding he was attending in

Christchurch, was blown away by the noise and support for the Terri Rae-trained galloper.

"It's not often you have people clapping and cheering with 400m to run in a race but that was what the atmosphere was like on Saturday," Wallace said.

"There are 56 members of the syndicate although not all of them were there, but there was a pretty big group when you counted family and friends and they were having a ball.

"It's experiences like yesterday that make racing such a wonderful sport and I'm thankful that I get to be a part of it."

The Galloping Wekas syndicates are the brain-child of Wallace's parents, well known racing and breeding enthusiasts Les and Janine Wallace.

The syndicates came about after Les suffered a bad injury when working with a horse, the injuries at one stage looking like they would force the Wallaces to abandon their racing and breeding interests.

"At one stage it looked like Mum and Dad might have to give up their involvement in horses after the accident," Wallace said.

"They managed to battle back and part of that was keeping the mare

Spera, who is the dam of Morweka and also Blue Hope, who is the dam of Skyweka, the first horse that was syndicated.

"I think Skyweka started off with about 10 people in the syndicate, and she won five races and was placed seven times, and with Morweka that number grew rapidly.

"The whole idea is to give people a taste of racing a horse at an affordable price.

"We've had such a great time and the demand for more syndicates

has meant we now have two other horses racing under the "Weka" brand, Wekaforce and Starweka, plus mum and dad are putting together another group to race a full brother to Morweka.

"He is a cracking yearling colt by Showcasing, a stallion that is absolutely flying, and he looks a really precocious sort that is paid up and eligible for the Karaka Million. There are a handful of shares left."

Wallace was also quick to pay tribute to Morweka's trainer Terri Rae

who had told the group Saturday's race had been the mare's target for quite some time.

"Terri has done a terrific job with Morweka and she had said to us she would have her ready to win first-up, so there were a few bets landed," he said.

"All congratulations should go to her and also jockey Lisa Allpress who rode her a treat."

While Wallace was still savouring the victory, the Galloping Wekas Syndicate Number Three had another horse in action at the Trentham meeting on Sunday, where **Starweka (NZ)** (Showcasing) finished fifth.

"I'm sure there were a few people on track to cheer her on and the main thing is win, lose or draw that everyone enjoys the experience," Wallace said.

"There are in excess of 100 people involved in the Galloping Weka syndicates, so mum and dad have done a great job of involving so many people and making it a lot of fun."

# PATIENCE REWARDED WITH BURGUNDY BELLE

Talented filly **Burgundy Belle (NZ)** (Burgundy) made it three wins from five starts when successful in the Crown Prosecutor Cup (1400m) at Trentham on Sunday, providing Te Akau trainer Jamie Richards with his 92nd win of the season.

The daughter of Burgundy had been in the reckoning for last week's Gr.3 Cambridge Breeders' Stakes (1200m), but connections took a patient approach with the three-year-old and were rewarded with a three and a-quarter-length success on the heavy 10 Trentham surface.

"We thought she was going well enough to be competitive in the Cambridge Breeders' Stakes, but John Galvin (of Fortuna Syndications) and I had a good talk after she drew badly and he was happy to wait for this race," Richards said.

"It looked ideal because she can handle heavy ground and we'd been pleased with her work.

"We left the blinkers off when resuming at Te Rapa, and left them off when getting up to 1400 metres today and we'll look to stretch her a little bit in distance. Although she wanted to go keenly early, I thought she settled nicely when some speed

went into the race. She quickened up and won quite well.

"She's an exciting filly and there certainly looks to be more wins in her."

Winning rider Johnathan Parkes, who later on the program notched his 100th winner for the season when successful on Shez Ekstra, was also of the opinion that Burgundy Belle has a bright future.

"I actually didn't want to be as handy as what I was, but we were posted a bit wide early and she wanted to get on with the job, so I let her roll forward and she was simply too good," Parkes said.

"She's a progressive filly and will carry on with the job."

Burgundy Belle is out of the Group Two winner Spin 'N Grin and is a product that Te Akau principal David Ellis had a strong hand in producing.

"I bought Spin 'N Grin as a yearling for \$65,000 out of the Premier Sale at Karaka, and Mark (Walker) trained her for Tom and Sue Roper," Ellis said.

"I took her over to breed from and Karyn (Fenton-Ellis) and I actually bred this filly. We sold her at the sales to John Galvin and she looks like another stakes quality filly like Windborne and Darci's Dream that I bred and John's Fortuna Syndicate owners have raced.

"This filly is the fifth individual winner from Spin 'N Grin and we've got a really classy Burgundy yearling colt at home from the mare that we've kept to race, and she's back in foal to Darci Brahma." – NZ Racing Desk

# SHINN CONFIRMED FOR VIGOR WINNER



*Vigor Winner is Queensland bound*

Prominent Australian jockey Blake Shinn has been confirmed to ride promising Cambridge three-year-old **Vigor Winner** (Declaration of War) when he competes at Eagle Farm later this month.

Cambridge trainer Lauren Brennan has confirmed Vigor Winner will make his Australian debut in the Gr.3 Fred Best Classic (1400m) on May 25 and is thrilled to have secured the services of Shinn.

"It's a bit of a coup getting him," Brennan said. "He's confirmed for the Fred Best and if the horse goes well we're hoping he will stick with him."

Brennan has pencilled in the Gr.2 Queensland Guineas (1600m) at Eagle Farm on June 8 as a second Australian start for Vigor Winner, but is playing it one step at a time.

"He's booked to go over to Brisbane on Sunday morning and at this stage everything is going to plan," she said. "He

came through his Te Rapa run in really good order.

"The Queensland Guineas is a bit closer to the Fred Best than we'd prefer. We've been spacing his races, but we'll just see how he goes first-up over there."

Vigor Winner sealed the Queensland trip when deadheating for first with Speedy Meady in the Gr.3 Cambridge Breeders' Stakes (1200m) at Te Rapa last start and has created a big impression with three wins and a close second from just four starts.

His sole defeat came in the Gr.2 Wellington Guineas (1400m) at Trentham on March 16 when beaten a half-head by Emily Margaret.

"I thought he'd just been beaten again in the Breeders' Stakes," Brennan said. "We've gone so close so many times this season with our horses and just been beaten.

“Magnum was just beaten by Sultan Of Swing at Te Rapa in December and Sword In The Stone was so close in the Waikato Guineas (Gr.3, 2000m).”

Magnum was put aside for a spell after finishing third in the Listed Flying Handicap (1400m) at Awapuni on March 30 and will be brought back for one further campaign in the spring, while Sword In Stone is currently in quarantine, being prepared to further his racing career in Hong Kong.

Sword In Stone created a big impression in three starts with a win and two placings and was left on the ballot for the Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m) at Ellerslie in March.

“I’d have loved to see him run in the Derby. He was ready for it,” Brennan said.

Though having lost Sword In Stone, Brennan is awaiting the return to work of the talented galloper Aim Smart and the

promising filly Anna Cecelia.

Aim Smart went amiss after finishing a close second at Hastings last September and has undergone a hock operation.

“He’s had screws put in the hock and is still out resting at Lyndhurst Farm,” Brennan said. “He’s due back in work in June or July and I’m really looking forward to having him back. He’s a smart horse.”

Anna Cecelia, a More Than Ready two-year-old filly raced by Sword In Stone’s owner, Paul Hickman, has shown promise with a last-start win and a third in three starts.

“I really rate her and that’s why I threw her in the deep end in a Group Three race (Eclipse Stakes, 1200m) in her first start,” Brennan said. “She’s due back in work within the next few weeks and I’ll get her ready for the three-year-old fillies races.”

# JAPAN TRIP OFF THE TABLE FOR BEAUTY GENERATION

Champion New Zealand-bred galloper **Beauty Generation (NZ)** (Road To Rock) will not travel to Japan for a Group One raid next month.

Owner Patrick Kwok Ho-chuen confirmed they will not press forward to the Gr.1 Yasuda Kinen (1600m) after completing a perfect season in Hong Kong.

The contest loomed as one of the races of the year with star Japanese mare Almond Eye touted to resume her preparation, while also coming up against the talented Danon Premium.

Beauty Generation, who saluted in all eight of his starts this term and extended his winning streak to nine, will instead rest and then connections will look to complete back-to-back perfect seasons.

Trainer John Moore said he was “very happy” with the decision made by the Kwok family and would continue to have the six-year-old son of Road To Rock ticking over at his Sha Tin stables in preparation for the 2019-20 season.

“The horse is not going to Japan,” Moore told the South China Morning Post.

“He’s had a long season and we want to have a horse for next season to put together the same number of wins and the same programme as we did this time around.”

Moore had previously stated connections had ambitions to better the unbeaten streak of Silent Witness with another perfect season in what would be Moore’s last with the Jockey Club forcing him to retire at the age of 70.

“He has a break now, he won’t go to China, he will stay here, keep him ticking over because he can be a bit naughty if he’s left doing nothing,” Moore said.

“I’m very happy with what the Kwok family have come up with, I’m happy with that plan.”
