DRAW GIVES SAVVY OAK SHOT AT GR.1 SA DERBY



Savvy Oak will try to break the Group One duck for Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young's Australian base on Saturday at Morphettville

Training partners Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young have endured a frustrating run in Group One races since making the move from New Zealand to Victoria almost three years ago.

Their last win at the highest level was Tavago (NZ) (Tavistock) in the 2016 Australian Derby (2400m), a few months before they transferred to their Cranbourne base.

They have had Group One placings, but that elusive winner has been a cause of frustration.

"Since Tavago won the Australian Derby we've run second in a Victoria Derby (Gr.1, 2500m) and New Zealand Derby (Gr.1, 2400m) since moving here," Young said.

"We've had placings in Group Ones but just can't get that win.

“The horses are running well so hopefully our luck is turning.”

Busuttin and Young get their latest shot at Group One success when **Savvy Oak (NZ)** (Savabeel) runs in Saturday’s South Australian Derby (2500m) at Morphettville in which he will be ridden by Michael Walker from barrier one.

“We’ve finally got a draw in a Derby, it’s brilliant,” Young said.

“We’ve got the ace draw.

“I think Michael will give him every chance, put him to sleep on the rail, cuddle him up so he can run the 2500m out and hopefully it’s not too wet in Adelaide.”

A debut winner at Echuca in August, Savvy Oak went on to run seventh in the Victoria Derby in November at his sixth race start.

Young said Savvy Oak was raw and green and being a late November foal was still a two-year-old in that race.

She said the penny had finally dropped and the gelding was more mature this time around.

What Busuttin and Young do not want to see is too much rain in Adelaide.

Young said Savvy Oak was thwarted by a wet track when beaten at his last start at Cranbourne.

“Just being that bit heavier he didn’t have that initial turn of foot but then hit the line.

“He worked nicely on Tuesday. He’ll travel over on Thursday night and chase another Derby and hopefully get our first Group One since we moved here.”

MILESTONE WINS BECKON LEADING TRAINER AT ROTORUA

Andrew Forsman doesn't have the same cricketing claim to fame as his training partner Murray Baker but he revealed he did rack up a couple of centuries as a schoolboy batsman at Te Awamutu College.

The thrill of bringing up three figures hasn't waned either as Forsman closes in on another century of winners in a season and bids to add to his tally of 102 stakes wins at Rotorua this weekend.

Forsman and Baker, an accomplished first-class cricketer who twice won the Plunket Shield with Central Districts in the late 1960s, will produce three runners in both the Gr.3 Campbell Infrastructure Rotorua Cup (2200m) and the Gr.3 ISCL Rotorua Stakes (1400m), aiming to replicate their wins in both races last year.

With Caballero's (NZ) (Cape Blanco) win at Matamata on Wednesday taking the stable to 98 wins for the season, Forsman is on the cusp of registering his fourth century since joining Baker in partnership in 2012.

"It's always nice to get to three figures. I did it a couple of times playing cricket when I was younger, but I wasn't much of a batsman," Forsman said.

"It would be nice if we could get there this weekend."

With five runners at New Plymouth and 10 at Rotorua, the prospects look bright, just as they do in the feature races at Arawa Park where **Highlad** (High Chaparral) and **Tomelilla (NZ)** (Tavistock) return to defend their crowns in the Rotorua Cup and Rotorua Stakes respectively.

High Chaparral five-year-old gelding Highlad was more seasoned last year when he carried 60kg to a three-length win under Jonathan Riddell, rather than just having one run back this preparation for a sixth placing over 1400m at Te Aroha last month.

“We’d have liked to have had one more run leading in but there was nothing suitable. He’s got a big weight (59kg) to carry again and with just one run in, that’s got to be the query with him,” Forsman said.

“But he’s working well. All three worked really well this (Thursday) morning.”

Joining Highlad are last year’s Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) runner-up **Zacada (NZ)** (Zabeel) and **Artiste (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman), a winner of six of her 30 starts.

“Zacada is another with a big weight (60kg) to carry. His form in Sydney was well below what he’s capable of. It was a bit of a head scratcher but he’s working really well and he deserves his shot.

“Artiste is an emerging lightweight (53kg) and while she hasn’t yet proven herself in a race like this, she deserves a throw at the stumps and she’ll probably go out after this.

“In both her last two runs she’s probably made her run a bit soon and she’s just peaked a bit but how long do you hold them up for when they are travelling as well as she has been? But we will probably tell Donovan [Mansour, jockey] to time his run a bit and hold her sprint till a bit later.”

TAB bookmakers rate Highlad as the best of the Baker-Forsman trio at \$6 ahead of Artiste at \$8.50 and Zacada at \$12 in a Rotorua Cup market headed by Azaboy (NZ) (Azamour) at \$4.50.

Like Highlad, Tomelilla is a \$6 shot to defend her title in the Rotorua Stakes, with stablemates **Peaceful (NZ)** (Savabeel) at \$10 and **Power O’Hata (NZ)** (Power) at \$17 behind favourites Back In A Flash (NZ) (Ekraar) at \$4.40 and Sleeping Beauty (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) at \$5.

“Power O’Hata is second on the ballot and needs a couple of scratchings and we wouldn’t want it too heavy for her with that bit of rain forecast,” Forsman said.

“But the rain will help Tomelilla. She performs on a heavy track and it shouldn’t worry Peaceful either. They have both drawn out a bit so that should help them find the best part of the track.”

Six-year-old Tavistock mare Tomelilla is reunited with Troy Harris, who was aboard for last year’s win, and Forsman expects an improved performance.

“The Easter Handicap was always shaping as a tough race for her from that wide draw and she just got too far back to be competitive, but this is a much more suitable race,” Forsman said.

“She’s working really well and we can’t really fault her. She was working well going into the Easter and it was just the draw that beat her. She’s going as well as she was when she won last year.

“Peaceful doesn’t lack anything on ringcraft either and she’s pretty much spot on for this too. She was just beaten by a sharper one last time and she’s still on the way up. We’ve just got to get her the best trip possible and see how she measures up - and I think she’ll measure up well.”

TRANS-TASMAN TILT **FOR TE AKAU**



Sasso Corbaro will attempt to add another stakes victory to the Jamie Richards season tally at Rotorua on Saturday

The Akau trainer Jamie Richards will take just the one runner to Arawa Park on Saturday, but that just may be enough to add another stakes win to his burgeoning tally this season.

The Matamata horseman will line-up the China Horse Club-owned **Sasso Corbaro** (All Too Hard) in the Gr.3 ISCL Rotorua Stakes (1400m) and he is hoping for a resurgence from his mare after she tailed the field home in the Listed NZB Finance Sprint (1200m) at Hastings last month.

“She pulled up with a blood irregularity after Hastings,” Richards said. “We are hopeful that is why she

didn’t perform up to expectations.”

The daughter of All Too Hard has only had the three starts in New Zealand for Richards and he said he was pleased with her previous two runs, which included a win first-up at Otaki in February before running on for sixth in the Listed Lightning Handicap (1200m) at Trentham in March.

“Her Lightning run was good,” he said. “She got well back and it’s hard to make ground there, but she did make good ground into sixth, so she wasn’t disgraced.

“She was pretty poor at Hastings, but she does have an excuse there so

we are hoping she can bounce back.”

Richards is happy enough with Sasso Corbaro heading into Saturday but admitted her wide barrier (19) isn’t ideal.

“She has drawn horribly again, she is not having a lot of luck with barriers,” he said. “She’s as good as we can have her and we would have been quite confident if she had drawn a gate.”

Sasso Corbaro will be tested over 1400m for the first time in New Zealand on Saturday, with her performance dictating what path Richards takes with her heading into winter.

“The question mark for Saturday is the 1400m,” he said. “If she runs out the 1400m there are a few more options coming up for her, soft-track-wise.

“We will just get through Saturday and then we can sit down and have a talk with the China Horse Club team and go from there.”

Meanwhile, stablemate

Mongolianconqueror (NZ) (Ocean Park) will be competing for Group Three glory across the Tasman when he lines-up in the Chairman’s Handicap (2000m) at Doomben on Saturday.

The Group One performer finished sixth when second-up in the Gr.2 Easter Handicap (1600m) at Ellerslie last month and Richards is hoping for an improved performance on Saturday.

“He just wasn’t that genuine from the 600m round to the straight,” he said. “He got on one rein and wouldn’t really take a gap.

“He could have followed the winner, Endless Drama, through, but just for one reason or another he wasn’t able to find his back. He was very good closing late, but in a pretty sharp handicap race it was well short of his best.”

Richards said Mongolianconqueror has settled in well to his new surroundings on the Gold Coast and Saturday’s run will dictate the remainder of his campaign, which could include a tilt at the Gr.2 Brisbane Cup (2400m) on June 8.

“He has travelled over in good order, we are pleased with him. Dad is over there with him staying on the Gold Coast and all reports are that the horse has settled in well,” Richards said.

“It’s a little bit of a wait and see on Saturday with him. He has drawn a good gate (barrier one) and should

get a nice run, but he has got to step up and be competitive against those Aussie stayers.

“We are looking forward to seeing how he performs up to them on the way to hopefully races like the Brisbane Cup.”



Our Libretto on path towards Brisbane Cup

Fresh from a midweek double at Sandown, trainer Grahame Begg is hoping to parlay that success into a stakes victory at Doomben.

Our Libretto will be Begg's sole runner on Saturday when she takes on the Gr.3 Chairman's Handicap (2000m) at Doomben. Begg has the Gr.2 Brisbane Cup (2400m) at Eagle Farm on June 8 as the main target for **Our Libretto**.

"She runs Saturday, then two weeks into the Premier's Cup over 2200 (metres) at Eagle Farm and then into the Brisbane Cup," Begg said.

Following a win at Caulfield on April 6, when ridden by Jamie Kah, **Our Libretto** finished sixth in the JRA Plate at Randwick on April 20 under Damian Lane who is currently riding in Japan.

Begg said the Randwick race did not pan out the way he had hoped.

"It was a slowly run race," Begg said. "She was back last and he tried to circle the field turning for home and got run off her legs.

"The winner cut back inside her and

pinched five lengths turning for home and her run was very good.

"The horse that finished beside her (Abdon) went out and won the Wagga Cup, so the form has worked out."

Following the Brisbane Cup, Begg said the mare was likely to remain in Brisbane to spell in the warmer climate before returning to Melbourne to prepare for the spring.



Beefeater (NZ) (Alamosa)

Beefeater aiming for Queensland glory

Hunterville farmers Christopher and Susanna Grace have experienced plenty of success as owners in Australia, with Group One-winning mare Shillelagh (NZ) (Savabeel) leading the charge, and they are hoping **Beefeater (NZ)** (Alamosa) can carry their green and yellow colours to glory across the Tasman in the coming months.

The ever-consistent six-year-old arrived in Queensland on Friday and trainer Roydon Bergerson said he has settled in well ahead of his first Australian assignment on Saturday, the Listed Members' Handicap (1600m) at Doomben.

"I'm very pleased with him, he has travelled over well," Bergerson said. "He teamed up with Jamie Richards' horse, Mongolianconqueroor, they travelled over together and are stabled together at Bevan Laming's. He's settled in really well, I couldn't be happier with him." [Full story here](#)

Sandown winner Asgard Massif on the market

Asgard Massif (Fastnet Rock) may cost any potential new owner a few extra dollars after an impressive all-the-way win at Sandown.

Trainer John Sadler revealed Asgard Massif is on the market as Singapore-based surgeon Dr Tan Kai Chah reduces his worldwide thoroughbred numbers.

Asgard Massif, who was sold out of Curraghmore's 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run draft, is a son of Jolie's Shinju (Jolie's Halo) who won the Singapore Triple Crown for Dr Tan in 2009 before travelling to Australia for the Gr.1 Cox Plate (2040m).

Asgard Massif carried the Melbourne Racing Club's emergency set of colours on Wednesday when successful in the Ladbrokes Back Yourself Handicap (1400m).

"Unfortunately Dr Tan didn't see his colours go around this time as they were left at Bendigo on Sunday," Sadler said.

"He's a very good client of the stable and unfortunately he wants to sell this bloke just when he's coming right.

"If someone wants a nice horse, he's really starting to mature and develop into something.

"He's on the market and I'd love to keep hold of him as he's a lovely horse." -AAP

Matamata double for Noble

Karaka trainer Lance Noble scored the perfect result at Matamata on Wednesday, taking two horses south for the Waikato club's meeting and recording victories with both.

Two-year-old Savabeel filly **Avadane (NZ)** cleared maiden company when taking out the J P Wills Bloodstock 1200.

She jumped well from barrier three and took the trail behind early leaders Divine Dive (NZ) (Sacred Falls) and Qiji Melody (Snitzel).

Jockey Leith Innes bided his time before unleashing his charge down the straight where Avadane took the lead at the 150m mark and saw off the fast-finishing Long Jack (So You Think) to win by a short-neck.

"The draw obviously helped and she did get away well and had a lovely ride from Leith. It was really pleasing," Noble said.

Her win extends her dam J'Adane's (NZ) (Danehill) impressive record, with Avadane becoming her sixth winner, which includes Group Three winners Von Tunzelman (NZ) (Zabeel), Prince Jabeel (Savabeel) and Sherrif (NZ) High Chaparral).

"It was the sixth individual winner out of Brendan and Jo's (Lindsay) foundation mare J'Adane, so it's pretty special for them," Noble said.

"The mare just keeps producing. There is a nice Tavistock colt at home and I look forward to getting my hands on him."

Earlier in the card four-year-old mare Vera Drake (Footstepsinthesand) won the Luminatone 1600.

It was the first win in New Zealand for the half-sister to dual Group Three winner and Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) runner-up Vengeur Masque (Monsun).

The four-year-old mare was purchased by Cambridge Stud principals Brendan and Jo Lindsay in England last year and is destined to join their broodmare band at their Waikato farm.

Piriaka too tough at Woodville

The Kevin Gray-trained **Piriaka (NZ)** (Tartan Bearer) cleared maiden company on Thursday when running down short-priced favourite Lincoln Hanover (NZ) (Showcasing) to win the Merrylees Hotel 1200 at Woodville.

Jumping from barrier two, the three-year-old filly was beaten for early speed and sat just off the pace in fifth position throughout.

Stable apprentice Holly Andrew kept her composure aboard the daughter of Tartan Bearer, biding her time before unleashing her charge down the straight where she was able to run home late to get the better of Lincoln Hanover by a neck.

Gray was pleased with Andrew's ride and said he is looking forward to campaigning his filly over sprint distances in the coming months.

"It was a very good ride today," Gray said. "She's been a bit unlucky in a couple of starts and she's only a pony.

"I am very pleased for (owners) Paul McGlade and the Taumaranui Racing Club and the syndicate up there.

"I think she is a speed horse and a bit of cut out of the ground you will see a lot more of her."

Andrew was just as pleased with the result and while the speed in the race was a little more than expected, she had faith that Piriaka would be able to close out the race strongly.

"There was more speed than I expected," she said. "I wanted to sit third or fourth, but it didn't work out that way.

"I didn't panic, I knew she is tough and she could fight in the finish."

Duffers Creek top of Fannin's list

Prominent jumps jockey Shaun Fannin has no doubt **Duffers Creek (NZ)** (Gold Centre) could be the horse to provide him with further highlights.

The 23-year-old was New Zealand's champion jumps jockey three seasons ago when his association with trainer Kevin Myers resulted in the pair dominating the scene and Fannin going from registering nine jumps wins the previous season to an incredible 25 wins, nine more than his closest rival on the table.

Fannin went on to 11 jumps wins two seasons ago and finish third on the list behind Aaron Kuru (20), then last term setbacks resulted in just six victories over fences. [Full story here](#)



Melody Belle (NZ) (Commands)

Te Akau stars back in work

Multiple Group One-winning mare **Melody Belle (NZ)** (Commands), along with exciting gallopers **Te Akau Shark (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) and **Sword of Osman (NZ)** (Savabeel) are back in work in preparation for a busy spring campaign.

Melody Belle is likely to be named New Zealand Horse of the Year after her five Group One victories this season and the darling of the New Zealand turf is being set

to better that mark next season.

The Jamie Richards-trained runner took out the first two legs of the Hawke's Bay Spring Carnival last year and will target all three legs next season after proving she can handle the 2040m distance of the Gr.1 Livamol Classic after victory in the Gr.1 Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (2000m) in March.

Te Akau Shark, who has won five of his six career starts, had a stellar spring, winning all three starts including the Gr.3 Red Badge Sprint (1400m) at Hastings and the Gr.2 Coupland's Bakeries Mile (1600m) at Riccarton.

The son of Rip Van Winkle was given a lengthy spell after pulling up with a few soreness issues after his Riccarton triumph and will now be set for some major spring targets, with a likely trip across the Tasman on the cards.

"He came back in with Sword of Osman and Melody Belle on Monday, they all look great," Richards said.

"Sword of Osman and Te Akau Shark have gone up to the beach at Waiuku for three or four weeks, just to ease them back into it.

"He has always been plagued a little bit by immaturity issues that have taken a fair while to settle down. He seems to be fine for three or four runs and then he needs a spell.

"He has had a good long break, he has got a heap of weight on and hopefully now that he is fully matured we could see him hopefully get to some of those good races in Australia."

Shinn confirmed for Vigor Winner

Prominent Australian jockey Blake Shinn has been confirmed to ride promising Cambridge three-year-old **Vigor Winner** (Declaration of War) when he competes at Eagle Farm later this month.

Cambridge trainer Lauren Brennan has confirmed Vigor Winner will make his Australian debut in the Gr.3 Fred Best Classic (1400m) on May 25 and is thrilled to have secured the services of Shinn.

"It's a bit of a coup getting him," Brennan said. "He's confirmed for the Fred Best and if the horse goes well we're hoping he will stick with him." [Full story here](#)



More Ballymore Stables hopes in Queensland

Ruby Armani (NZ) (Makfi) and **Za Za Gabor** (O'Reilly) are to join three stablemates at the Queensland Winter Carnival.

The pair are booked on a flight to Brisbane on Sunday and will team up with On The Rocks (NZ) (Alamosa), Pinmedown (NZ) (Pins) and She's A Thief (NZ) (Showcasing), who are already in Queensland and set to represent Mike Moroney and Pam Gerard's Ballymore Stables in black type features.

Ruby Armani, a winner of five races, and Za Za Gabor, a last-start third placegetter at Ellerslie, are to be set for the lesser stakes races.

"This is the last season for Ruby Armani and it's a good chance to chase a bit of black-type away from the top ones," Gerard said. "As for Za Za Gabor, she'll run out of town to start with and if she's going well she may hang around for the Ipswich Cup (Listed 2150m) later on."

Meanwhile, Gerard reports On The Rocks, Pinmedown and She's A Thief have settled in well in Brisbane and are on target for their first-up runs.

On The Rocks will start on Saturday week in the Gr.1 Doomben Cup (2000m) and may then contest the Gr.2 Brisbane Cup (2400m) at Eagle Farm on June 8.

Pinmedown will also make her Australian debut on May 18, in the Gr.2 The Roses (2000m) as a lead-up to the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks (2400m) at Eagle Farm on June 1, while She's A Thief is being considered for the Eagle Farm meeting on Saturday as well as the Listed Bright Shadow Quality (1200m) the following weekend.

Peters to open May Sale


New Zealand Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Racing will open New Zealand Bloodstock's May Sale at their Karaka complex on May 17.


