## GROUP ONE WINNING SON OF SNITZEL TO MAPPERLEY STUD



*Group One-winning juvenile Summer Passage will commence stallion duties at Mapperley Stud later this year.*

Mapperley Stud has added Snitzel's Group One winning son, **Summer Passage**, to their five-strong stallion roster ahead of the 2019 breeding season, where he will stand for a fee of \$8,000+GST.

An A\$800,000 yearling, Summer Passage was a high-class juvenile, winning the Listed Reid & Harrison Slipper (1200m) before showing sustained speed when crossing from the outside barrier to win the Gr.1 Sistema Stakes (1200m) in emphatic fashion.

The Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott-trained colt then proved he was up with the best of his generation across the Tasman, when a brave second to Invader in the Gr.1 Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m), defeating subsequent Group One winners Trapeze Artist (Snitzel) and The Mission (Choisir).

Raced by Hermitage Thoroughbreds, Summer Passage had a mixed campaign at three when plagued by a back injury, with the highlight being a second placing in the Gr.3 Caulfield Guineas Prelude (1400m) behind Perast (Snitzel), with Kementari (Lonhro) in third.

The entire failed to fire in five-starts in Hong Kong and was subsequently retired and becomes the first son of Australia's champion sire Snitzel to stand at stud in New Zealand.

Mapperley Stud principal Simms Davison was delighted to secure the precocious Group One winner and believes Summer Passage will add balance to the Matamata nursery's roster, complementing barn-mates **Contributer**, **Complacent**, **Puccini** and **He's Remarkable**.

"I had been looking for a horse ever since I lost Atlante, a precocious, physically strong horse who not only appealed to the Australian market but to traders, as far as not having to wait long to get a horse up and going," Davison said.

"Summer Passage ticked all those boxes. We all know what he did as a two-year-old, especially in that Sistema Stakes when he had drawn wide. He stormed around the whole lot and charged to the front and he showed how tough he was.

"His run for second in the Sires' Produce in Australia was exceptional, defeating a quality line-up which included Trapeze Artist.

"It is a funny old game, if he had won that day he would probably be standing for \$40,000 or \$50,000 over in Australia.

"With all the sons of Snitzel starting to stand at stud, it is only going to be a matter of time before one of them puts their hand up and is the real deal and there is no reason why it won't be Summer Passage."

Davison said Summer Passage was an imposing type and he took great heart from the good judges who selected the horse as a yearling.

"Lance O'Sullivan has a great client in Hermitage Thoroughbreds and every year they give him a pretty big cheque to go and buy a top colt. Lance, Paul and Dave O'Sullivan went over there (to Australia) and this was the colt they picked out.

"There wouldn't be many better judges than those three walking around a sale complex."

Davison was pleased to be able to stand Summer Passage at a value that would enable commercial breeders to get a return.

"There was no point in me getting the horse and standing him at money that I thought would be too tough for this environment, so it is great to get him here and stand him at \$8,000.

"We are also selling some limited lifetime breeding rights to him. I don't know how long they will stay around because once they are gone, they are gone."

Summer Passage is out of a winning mare by Australia's champion broodmare sire, Encosta de Lago.

His third dam Subterfuge is the dam of six stakes performers, including top-class gallopers Shania Dane and Scintillation.

The red-and-green silks of the Chuang family's Hermitage Thoroughbreds have been regularly worn to success in recent years, with horses the ilk of The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice), Egg Tart (Sebring) and Willie Cazals (Aussie Rules) joining Summer Passage as elite level-winners for the Hong Kong owners.

"Hermitage will be strongly supporting the horse," Davison said. "They will be sending up to ten mares a year for the first three years, which should help give him every opportunity and I would expect a number of prominent breeders to also support the horse."

Davison has also focussed on improving the quality of Mapperley Stud's broodmare band and he has recently been active at the Sydney broodmare sale and is keen to source more mares to support his young stallion roster.

"Our own numbers are up around 70 mares, but I would like to get it down to about 60 and increase the quality," Davison said.

"It has been a great Autumn for us, with Brutal (Gr.1 Doncaster winner) and Rattan (Group Two winner and Group One placed in Hong Kong) who were both bred off the place."

Davison has also set the fees for Contributor (\$12,500+GST), Complacent (\$5,000+GST), Puccini (\$5,000+GST) and He's Remarkable (\$3,000+GST).

"I am really excited about Contributor. I think about 65 percent of his horses went to Australia and his yearlings were well received," Davison said.

"Godolphin has six yearlings by him getting broken in and they are absolutely rapt with them. They were taking all their mares home but have left them here to go again, such was the impression his stock have made.

"I have some ripper weanlings this year by Complacent. I feel his book of mares in his second year is almost better than his first. They were nice yearlings and for their first year they sold well at Karaka and the next ones will be another level up.

"I am really happy with Puccini, whose eldest are foals, and the type he has left. They are athletic horses and have really come on as well. Monovale Farm (who bred and raced him) have been big supporters and are going to keep a lot of them and race them. They will get every chance."

# WALLER SET FOR MORE QUEENSLAND CARNIVAL RECORDS

Champion trainer Chris Waller is making a habit of achieving winter carnival records and he is set to equal a few more with his mares **Shillelagh (NZ)** (Savabeel) and Youngstar (High Chaparral) in the Gr.1 Doomben Cup (2000m).

They will join another mare in **Savvy Coup (NZ)** (Savabeel) as well as their male stablemates Life Less Ordinary (Thewayouare) and Mister Sea Wolf (Amadeus Wolf) and according to bookmakers they are the horses to beat.

Mares have a poor record in the Doomben Cup with only Cinque Cento (Nothin' Leica Dane) (2007) and Streama (Stratum) (2014) winning the race since it went to weight-for-age in 1990.

But Youngstar and Shillelagh have the right credentials to battle out the Cup and become only the second mares to run the quinella in the race after Cinque Cento beat Gaze (NZ) (Cape Cross).

Shillelagh, raced by breeder-owners Christopher and Susanna Grace, was fifth to the mighty Winx (Street Cry) in the Gr.1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes (2000m) at her last start.

Waller is currently equal with John Wheeler on

three Cup wins, a fourth would have him match Lee Freedman's tally.

Most of Waller's team has been on the Gold Coast and worked there on Tuesday morning.

Waller's Queensland manager Paul Shailer said the team had progressed well after most of them ran in the Hollindale Stakes two weeks ago.

"I was a bit shocked to hear no four-year-old mare has won the Cup.

"Then again a few people say it is no longer a race for (horses like) Might and Power, Rough Habit, Durbridge, etcetera.

"So it is probably best to not worry and take it as it is."

Shailer said Shillelagh had missed the Hollindale because of the wet track but also had class on her side.

"She has done plenty of work and provided we don't get a wet track she will be hard to beat," he said. - AAP

# STALLIONS INTRODUCED AND FAREWELLED IN KARAKA MAY SALE

New Zealand Bloodstock's 2019 Karaka May Sale is set to showcase stallions at opposite ends of their careers.

Condensed into a single day of selling, this year's mixed bloodstock sale will be held at Karaka on Friday.

On one hand, the 240-lot catalogue features first-crop weanlings by 11 new entrants to New Zealand's stallion ranks.

There are eight weanlings by Haunui Farm's Gr.1 Dewhurst Stakes

(1400m) and Lockinge Stakes (1600m) winner Belardo. Four-time Group One winner Preferment, who stands at Brighthill Farm, will be represented by the same number.

Waikato Stud stallion Tivaci, who ended his career on a high with a Group One win in the All Aged Stakes (1400m), has five weanlings in the catalogue. So do Westbury Stud's Gr.1 ATC Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m) placegetter Telperion and the French Group One-winning Rich Hill Stud

shuttler, Vadamos.

Multiple Group One-winning miler Turn Me Loose, who stands at Windsor Park Stud, and Westbury's Gr.1 Victoria Derby (2500m) winner Tarzino each have four first-crop weanlings in the catalogue.

Mapperley Stud's Puccini is the sire of two weanlings in the May Sale, as does Highview Stud's Group One-winning stallion Wrote, while the Windsor Park pair of Rageese and

Vanbrugh have one each. There is also one weanling by the Australian sire Flying Artie, a brilliant winner of the Gr.1 Coolmore Stud Stakes (1200m).

At the other end of the spectrum, there are the final crops of stallions who have either died or ceased shuttling to this part of the world.

Showcasing made a huge impression in eight seasons shuttling to Haunui Farm, and a large hole was left in New Zealand's stallion ranks when Whitsbury Manor kept him permanently in the northern hemisphere following the 2017 southern hemisphere spring.

The scale of that loss has been vividly illustrated by an incredible 12 individual two-year-old winners in New Zealand this season. That tally is a modern-day record.

The May Sale catalogue features six

weanlings from Showcasing's final New Zealand crop.

Another major loss from Kiwi stallion ranks has been Waikato Stud stalwart Pins, who died in April of last year. His progeny has excelled since then, 10 of them winning at black-type level including the Multiple Group One winner Madison County, Group Two winners Pinmedown and Emily Margaret, and Group Three winners Princess Kereru, Purple Sector and Residential. The May sale features one weanling from Pins' final crop, plus five mares.

Pentire was another sad loss during the 2017-18 season. Rich Hill Stud's foundation stallion produced star performers over a range of distances, from 10-time Group One-winning sprinter-miler Mufhasa to brilliant middle-distance horse Xcellent, all

the way up to Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) winner Prince Of Penzance.

Two Pentire mares feature in the catalogue, along with two by the recently deceased Australian champion Redoute's Choice.

In a varied group of vendors, Haunui Farm and Brighthill Farm will present the largest offerings of 27 and 26 horses respectively.

Graduates of this sale have enjoyed remarkable racetrack success in recent seasons. Triple Group One-winning cult hero Gingernuts cost just \$5,000 as a weanling in 2014, while other black-type stars to come out of the sale include Group One winners I Am A Star, Ladies First, and Yourdeel, who completed New Zealand's juvenile Group One double this season in the Sistema Stakes (1200m) and Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m).

# PHELAN SHOWCASES HIS VERSATILITY AT TE RAPA

**S**haun Phelan will wear two hats at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Cambridge horseman will don his riding helmet for two jumps rides at the prestigious raceday as well as putting on his trainer's hat to help saddle **Big Mike (NZ)** (Don Eduardo) and **Notabadidea (NZ)** (Highly Recommended).

Both horses look strong chances in two of the flat race features, but the day's highlights will be the jumps races, with Phelan chasing an elusive Fairview Motors Waikato Hurdles (3200m) win aboard the Toby Autridge-trained **Tommyra (NZ)** (Raise the Flag).

"He's one I've had a bit of faith in this season and I didn't mind his run for third the other day," Phelan said.

"Lat season he was a fit horse with all his flat runs under his belt before he went jumping and I think he'll be spot on for Saturday now and back to the minimum weight will help him.

"I rode him a bit wrong last time. I more rode him to beat Hesalljazz - and he was the one to beat - and had him a bit handier, and as it turned out Wilijonmcbride took my line on a few jumps which really didn't help.

"I'll ride him a bit quieter this time."

TAB bookmakers opened Tommyra as a \$6.50 fourth favourite for the Waikato Hurdles behind No Change (NZ) (Shinko King) at \$4.60, Guy Fox (NZ) (Zed) at \$4.80 and It's A Wonder (NZ) (Istidaad) at \$5.50.

Phelan's other ride at Te Rapa is aboard maiden hurdler El Fernando (NZ) (El Hermano) for Cambridge trainer

Mark Brooks.

"He's a big chance. He's a good flat horse and he jumps pretty good," Phelan said.

On the training front, Phelan and his co-trainer and father Craig will produce Listed Pakenham Cup (2500m) winner Big Mike in the Dunstan Feeds 2100 as a potential precursor to the Gr.2 Brisbane Cup (2400m) at Doomben.

"It was a stuff-up running in the Easter Handicap last time. The track was too firm for him and he went too fast in front but he did look after himself a bit when he knew he was beaten," Phelan said.

"His first-up run at Te Rapa was very good and if you forgive him the Easter, his form is all right and he did win this race last year. We gave him a couple of weeks with Catherine Cleghorn at the

beach after Ellerslie and he's come back looking great."

Big Mike is a \$2.50 favourite for the open handicap, ahead of Al Haram (Sea The Stars) at \$3.30.

Notabadidea gives the Phelan stable a good chance in the Kerr & Ladbrook Caterers @ Te Rapa 1600 later in the day after a solid last-start third to Group Two winner Pinmedown (NZ) (Pins) at Te Rapa.

"He was a good early three-year-old coming back and taking a few runs to get him fit. There wasn't really a suitable race around for him against his own age so he's in this and on his form from last start, he'd go pretty close," Phelan said.

"It should be a fun day - certainly a bit of a mixed-lolly bag for me."

### Cambridge Stud announce 2019 service fees

Cambridge Stud has recognised the wider industry's move to provide support to breeders, with the announcement of their 2019 stud fees.

A number of studs have reduced fees to enable breeders the opportunity to make greater commercial returns.

Cambridge Stud have responded in kind by reducing the stud's flagship stallion **Tavistock (NZ)** (Montjeu) to a fee of \$50,000+GST for the upcoming season, down \$15,000 from last year. ### Grassyards Farm doubles stallion roster

Otago stud farm, Grassyards Farm, is doubling its stallion roster this coming breeding season, and studmaster Jason Coutts has an innovative carrot to dangle in front of prospective breeders.

Coutts has secured the services of Howard Be Thy Name, a Group One-winning son of the late champion sire Redoute's Choice and Group Two-winning Faltaat mare Bellini Rose (NZ).

He is offering \$30,000 and a free service to the breeders who produce the first two-year-old winner of Howard Be Thy Name, and that offer will be repeated for the breeders of the first three-year-old winner by the stallion.

The six-year-old entire had a successful career on the track, winning five of his 23 career starts, including the Gr.1 South Australian Derby (2500m), Gr.3 Chairman's Stakes (2020m), and Listed Port Adelaide Guineas (1800m).

He was also runner-up in the Listed Tasmanian Derby (2200m) and was placed in

the Gr.3 Grand Prix Stakes (2200m).

Howard Be Thy Name will stand alongside Prince Of Brooklyn at Grassyards Farm for a fee of \$5000+GST.



War Decree

### Status quo for Inglewood Stud

After a pleasing first season at stud, exciting young stallion **War Decree** will return to Inglewood Stud in 2019 where he will stand at an unchanged fee of \$6,500+GST.

"We were rapt with the response to War Decree," Inglewood Stud's Gus Wigley said.

"For a non-syndicated horse to serve just under 100 mares speaks volumes about his appeal as a stallion.

"He drew mares from all over the country and the quality was outstanding, on one day alone he covered maiden siblings to Australian Group One winners Ace High, Shamexpress and Who Shot Thebarman."

A winner of the prestigious Gr.2 Vintage Stakes (1400m) at Goodwood, War Decree is a son of War Front, North America's most expensive stallion commanding a service fee of US\$250,000.

War Decree is owned in partnership with Kevin Hickman of Valachi Downs, who has proven as enthusiastic about the stallion as Wigley.

"Kevin got right behind the horse last year buying some nice mares on the Gold Coast specifically for him and sending down 15 mares in all," Wigley said.

"War Decree is such an amazingly fertile horse, he nailed his first 18 pregnancy tests in a row, and we were rapt to repay Kevin's support by sending all of his mares home in foal.

"Our search for a new stallion took four years and we chased War Decree for over 12 months, so we were obviously keen to support him heavily ourselves.

"We've got some lovely mares lined up for

him this season, including a young half-sister to this season's Golden Slipper winner Kiamichi, along with black-type producing mares Mystique, Dolly's Wig, Udeditagain and Secret Scent among others."

### Belle Roc out to cap a big week for Smith

Progressive filly **Belle Roc (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) can cap a big week for veteran trainer Brian Smith if she wins the Gr.2 The Roses (2000m) at Doomben on Saturday.

Belle Roc will be aiming to become the first Queensland-trained filly to claim the 2000-metre feature - the traditional lead-up to the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks on June 1 - since Bryan Guy won the race with Lasoron in 2007.

Smith has laid a perfect foundation for Belle Roc's Queensland Oaks campaign, gradually stepping the filly up in distance in her five starts this campaign. [Full story here](#)

### Connors shooting for repeat double

Wanganui trainer Raymond Connors will bid to defend two feature race crowns when he lines up horses at Te Rapa and Awapuni on Saturday.

Connors will seek back-to-back wins in the Signature Homes Waikato Steeplechase (3900m) at Te Rapa with **Max (NZ)** (Gallant Guru), while **She's Poppy (NZ)** (Alamosa) looks to make it successive wins in the Listed James Bull Rangitikei Gold Cup (1600m) at Awapuni.

### History Beaudz Well for exciting juvenile

Taranaki trainer John Wheeler believes he has another exciting juvenile by Grangewilliam Stud stallion Zed on his hands, with the athletic prowess to mirror his star-studded ownership, which includes All Black first five-eighth Beauden Barrett.

He trained Irish Flame (NZ) (Zed) to win the Gr.3 2YO Classic (1200m) at New Plymouth two years ago and he is hoping stablemate **Beaudz Well (NZ)** (Zed) is capable of reaching those same lofty heights.

### Fighter strikes for Purton in France Galop Cup

Zac Purton questioned **Racing Fighter's (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) fortitude in the lead-up to the Class 3 France Galop Cup Handicap (1200m) at Happy Valley but the grey didn't shirk on Wednesday night, lugging top-weight to a length success.

"I finally got the win out of him!" the champion jockey said after collecting the silverware.

Purton's first ride on Dennis Yip's charge

had delivered a breakthrough victory but that was back in December: four subsequent pairings produced three frustrating seconds and a third-place return.

"I said pre-race he'd been very consistent but he'd had many chances to get that next win and he's just been throwing his races away, so it was time to try something different," he said.

"Coming to Happy Valley was a bit of a risk because he's a quirky horse and the gate (seven) wasn't ideal with the make-up of the race, so I had to make use of him early. But he got the job done and he's done it with a big weight (133lb) on his back – it's not easy to do – so hopefully things click with him a little bit more and he'll be able to go on with it."

The fact that Racing Fighter raced down the straight without another horse delivering a pressing challenge might have been beneficial too.

"Maybe he's taken some confidence out of that – I hope so," Purton said.

Racing Fighter was purchased as a yearling out of Mapperley Stud's 2016 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier draft and was Group Two placed in New Zealand under the name As You Will. - HKJC



Familia (NZ) (Makfi)

### Stakes target for Familia

Two-year-old filly **Familia (NZ)** (Makfi) continued the good run of form of horses owned by Cambridge Stud proprietors Brendan and Jo Lindsay when successful at Ruakaka on Wednesday in the Sunline – Vale Trevor McKee Maiden 2YO (1000m).

Prepared by Lance Noble, Familia was given a perfect on-pace ride by Sam Spratt to win at her first start and frank her strong trial form.

"It's nice to get another two-year-old winner leading into next season. It gives us something to look forward to," Noble said.

"Sam summed it up really well. We knew

she'd jump well, and she was able to hold the others out, which was great. She was a little bit green up the straight, but I thought she stuck on well."

Noble said the daughter of Makfi would likely step-up to stakes company at Wanganui on June 1 at her next outing.

"We may look at the Castletown Stakes (Listed, 1200m) in a couple of weeks," Noble said.

"It is likely to be wet down there, and we are not sure that she will handle it but while she is going well, we might have a crack at that."



Intrigue (NZ) (Showcasing)

### Important Sunshine Coast victory for Intrigue

The Tony Pike-trained **Intrigue (NZ)** (Showcasing) added some all-important prizemoney to her career earnings when successful at the Sunshine Coast over 2200m on Wednesday, stepping back in grade after finishing seventh in the Listed Gold Coast Bracelet (1800m) on an unsuitable heavy track.

The daughter of Showcasing made light-work of her three-year-old rivals and the A\$27,500 first prizemoney will go a long way to ensuring the filly gains a Group One start, holding nominations for both the Gr.1 Queensland Oaks (2200m) and Gr.1 Queensland Derby (2400m).

The in-form stable has saddled three winners in succession in Queensland, following The Bostonian's (NZ) (Jimmy Choux) win in the Gr.1 Doomben 10,000 (1200m) on Saturday and Simply Sacred's (Blackfriars) success at Ipswich on Sunday.

"We hope things just continue the way it's going," stable foreman Chris McNab said.

### Tiley unleashes QLD maiden winner

Debut performer **Carrera To The Max** (Snitzel) ensured travel expenses for a visit to Queensland were more than covered when successful in an A\$25,000 1000m maiden at the Sunshine Coast on Wednesday.

Prepared by Pukekohe trainer Nigel Tiley, who is campaigning a team in Queensland this winter, Carrera To The Max provided jockey Leith Innes with a race-to-race double after an earlier victory on Intrigue (NZ) (Showcasing).

A daughter of Snitzel, Carrera To The Max had two trials in New Zealand in preparation for her first-up Australian assignment, and made good use of her inside gate to be prominent throughout before proving too strong for Love Ya Blue (Love Conquers All) over the concluding stages.

"She got herself a little fired up today, which is not like her, but she will learn a lot from the experience," Tiley said.

"She has always shown me plenty, but she has just been a little bit slow to mature. She is a big girl, so today's hit-out will do her the world of good.

"I wasn't sure how she would handle the ground, because I have never really galloped her on a wet track at home.

"She is by Snitzel out of a Pins mare, so she has got a bit going for her."

Tiley has not planned too far ahead for the three-year-old filly as he hopes to work her through the grades in Queensland through the winter.

"We won't be pressing too many buttons with her," he said.

"We will probably find another race around here somewhere and she might have four or five runs this time in and step her through the grades."

### Lady Bethany romps home at Murray Bridge

**Lady Bethany (NZ)** (Niagara), who raced in New Zealand as Bethany, showed her potential when racing away to a comfortable 10 length victory over 1400m at Murray Bridge on Wednesday.

The daughter of Niagara had eight starts in New Zealand for five placings and was sent across the Tasman to Michael Hickmott earlier this year to tackle some Australian spoils.

"She is owned by Trish Dunell, who along with her husband Graham Mackie are very good friends of mine in New Zealand," Hickmott said.

He was a bit apprehensive heading into Wednesday's contest after his stable was ravaged by a virus.

"They sent her across and I thought I would qualify her for the provincial super series, either the 1800m or 1400m final," Hickmott said.

"She ran here first-up the other day and I was gutted. I know the track didn't play well but she went horrendous (finishing fifth).

"Subsequent to that I had a pretty bad virus go through the stable and came here today a little bit gun shy, knowing how good she works and what she shows at home, but she probably should be beating horses like that on her good Kiwi form."

Lady Bethany will now head for a spell after performing well over a lengthy campaign.

"Trish just called me before, she said I have got no choice, she will be going to the paddock," he said.

"She wants her to have a little break now, she had a big time of it in New Zealand and came across here and she has fought off a few bugs."

### Bullish Boss has Count cruising ahead of Kranji Mile

Glen Boss has been talking up **Countofmontecristo's (NZ)** (Echoes of Heaven) Kranji Mile chances after the barrier trials on Tuesday.

The high praise the Australian jockey lavished on the Michael Clements-trained star after he won his trial could not have been more flattering.

"The last time the barrier trial was that good before a big win was when Lim's Cruiser won the Lion City Cup," Boss said.

"Lim's Cruiser trialled unbelievable in the lead-up and Countofmontecristo gave me the same unbelievable feeling this morning.

"He had the blinkers on. We stand nothing to lose, he reacts to them, which is good.

"He sat quiet in fourth and he just put it away when I asked him. It was a great trial.

"I've ridden him at his last three starts now, and I can tell you this horse has reached his peak at the right moment."

Boss said he would still head into the race on May 25 with an open mind about tactics even if his daring gamble to come from behind nearly paid off in his last start when runner-up in the Chairman's Trophy.

"He's always been chased down, and I thought why not be the one to chase down that day," said Boss.

"We almost pulled it off.

"Debt Collector and him are the two best local horses in the race. Without a doubt, Debt Collector is the better horse, but my bloke is a close second."-STC

# ARCHER SAVOURS DOOMBEN 10,000 TRIUMPH

David Archer had already scaled some of racing's highest peaks with his 10-time Group One winner Mufhasa (NZ) (Pentire), but last weekend he was right back at the summit.

The Archer family's home-bred star **Bostonian (NZ)** (Jimmy Choux), who races as The Bostonian in Australia, scored a stunning upset victory in Saturday's Gr.1 Doomben 10,000 (1200m) in Brisbane – beating a field featuring the elite Australian sprinters Osborne Bulls (Street Cry) and Nature Strip (Nicconi).

"Days like that are what you live for in racing," Archer said. "All wins are special because they're so hard to get, but a race like the Doomben 10,000 is on another level.

"The reaction to this one has been amazing. We've been inundated with congratulations from so many people. It always amazes me how many wonderful, down-to-earth people we have in this industry."

Saturday's triumph was clocked at a sizzling 1:08.97 – the fastest of four runnings since the race was reduced to 1200m.

It was the eighth win from 15 starts for the Tony Pike-trained Bostonian, and the Jimmy Choux gelding is undefeated in four starts in Queensland.

"Tony Pike told me that only three Kiwi horses have won 1200m stakes races in Australia in the last decade, so Saturday's win really was a remarkable achievement," Archer said.

"Nature Strip and Osborne Bulls are top-quality sprinters, so we knew they'd be hard to beat. They ran incredibly fast, breaking the race record. We enjoyed the run of the race, thanks to a beautiful ride by Michael Cahill, and our boy did the rest with such a strong finish.

"I was there with Diane (Wright, partner), my son and his partner. Doomben welcomed us with open arms and it was a really great day."

As well as the mighty Mufhasa, the distinctive grey and blue Archer colours have also been carried by the Gr.1 Zabeel Classic (2000m) winner Gallions Reach (NZ) (Victory Dance),

and the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) placegetter (Sir) Charles Road (Myboycharlie). Archer is also known for his industry-supporting insurance company FastTrack Insurance.

While those other Archer stars were all Karaka yearling purchases – Mufhasa for \$50,000, Gallions Reach for \$30,000 and Charles Road for \$90,000, Bostonian is different.

"The fact that we bred him ourselves does add something to it," Archer said. "Being out of a half-sister to Mufhasa makes it quite special as well.

"We entered Bostonian for the Karaka sales as a yearling, but Brent Taylor, who raised him and prepared him for us at Trelawney, just told us he wasn't quite right in the lead-

up to the sale. He said he had buyers all over him, but he wasn't quite right and we might be better to hold on to him. I remember him telling me, 'He might be the cheapest good horse you've ever owned.' He was so right, and we've been very fortunate with how that turned out."

Bostonian's dam, Keepa Cheval (NZ) (Keeper), is part of a small but select broodmare band.

"We're not big-time breeders, but we're lucky enough to have a couple of very nice mares now," Archer said. "We also have Seven Schillings, who produced this season's Group Two winner Emily Margaret. Another of her foals, Heptagon, has won seven in Australia.

"Our racing team isn't very big either. This year we've essentially just had three – Bostonian, Charles Road and

Amano. I think Amano might develop into a really nice four-year-old next season.

"But we've also got Come In Spinner, who's a talented horse but has spent about 18 months on the sidelines after fracturing his back. He's gone over to Queensland and might resume on the Sunshine Coast this weekend.

"We like to buy one or two horses a year to add to our stocks. We bought a couple of nice babies last year who are coming along well, and at Karaka in January this year we were able to pick up a lovely Sacred Falls colt from Waikato Stud and a beautiful Per Incanto from Little Avondale.

"So, from the current level of three or four, we might have a racing team of eight or nine in the not-too-distant future. It's exciting and we've got a lot to look forward to."
